Departmental News & Updates

Athletic Park Redevelopment Project

At the July 19th Council meeting, Council formally accepted the Athletic Park Redevelopment Plan, as presented at the June 14th Council-in-Committee meeting. The *Athletic Park Redevelopment Plan* includes four phases of improvements:

Phase 1 - Central trail improvements, multi-use path circuit, outdoor fitness stations and an enlarged soccer field - \$1,646,000

Phase 2 - Multi-purpose building, splash pad/skating rink, relocated beach volleyball court, multi-sport courts, tennis courts, table tennis, food truck venue and sunny/shady seating - \$5,998,000

Phase 3 - Six new pickleball courts and an extended parking lot, adding sixty-six new parking spaces - \$1,420,000

Phase 4 - Skating loop, multi-purpose performance space, amphitheater seating and second Peewee size baseball field - \$3,098,000

The total cost, \$12,162,000 reflects a Class D estimate with 2023 pricing.

One of the more exciting aspects of the redevelopment project is the shift in focus from "Athletic Park" to a "Community Park". This is a deliberate and planned approach, as the proposed design would serve as a draw to the community at large with its central location and being adjacent to the New Maryland Elementary School. The redeveloped "Community Park" would serve a larger population of residents and non-residents that do not currently use the park, as the proposed elements are not only inclusive but lend themselves to a more "drop-in" unstructured park usage. Senior staff were directed to move forward with applications for the project in its entirety once funding programs become available in the Fall.

Important Points to Remember:

- Bags of leaves will <u>NOT</u> be picked up by Fero prior to Nov. 1st and 2nd.
- ONLY compostable paper leaf bags will be accepted. Plastic bags will no longer be accepted.
- ONLY bagged leaves will be collected by Fero. (no loose piles of leaves)
- NO branches, NO garbage, NO twigs, NO animal waste, NO yard debris, NO grass clippings will be accepted.
- Any bags of leaves that are found to contain items other than leaves will be left at the curb for residents to clean up and dispose of themselves.

PREPAREDNESS

The Council for the Village of New Maryland established an **Emergency Response Planning Committee (ERPC)** on January 20, 1999. The mandate of the Committee is to advise Council on the preparation and implementation of ERPC activities and training.

Per our *Procedural By-law No. 50-2021*, the membership of the Committee is comprised of designated members of staff, the Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) Director, RCMP, Canadian Red Cross, Fredericton Amateur Radio Club, York Sunbury Ground Search and Rescue, Ambulance NB, Horizon Health Network, Anglophone West School District, Faith Baptist Church, New Maryland Lions Club, and the Parish of New Maryland Zoomers.

The Village of New Maryland has a detailed **Emergency Response Plan** and an Emergency Operations Centre (normally functioning as the Council Chamber) which is located at the Village Office, 584 New Maryland Highway.

The Committee meets regularly and routinely exercises its plan. Other activities of the Committee include: contingency planning for high-risk hazards and/or emergency situations which have been identified by the Committee, regular updating and review of the Emergency Plan pre-identifying evacuation and reception centres, conducting training and exercises designed to test the Emergency Response Plan, and involvement with provincial agencies and other municipalities for planning and initiating mutual response agreements.

COMING SOON: A new emergency alert system to replace the now discontinued Sentinel system; however, in the meantime, residents are encouraged to sign up for our E-News, which can be done by visiting our website and stay tuned to our Facebook, Twitter and Website for updates. Please visit our website at www.vonm.ca to review Emergency Planning and Preparedness Information. If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact the Village Office at 506-451-8508.

Now that the new school season has begun, please SLOW DOWN and watch for children as they are walking to and from school. Please remember to STOP at all stop signs and obey school bus stop lights.

Reminder! The posted speed limit on all Village streets is 40 km/h. Construction along the New Maryland Highway is still underway. Please be cautious and watch out for other motorists, students, and school buses. We appreciate your patience!

Animal Control Information

The Village has contracted services of an Animal Control/Protection Officer through the NB SPCA.

REPORTING ANIMAL CONTROL ISSUES: Issues such as stray dogs, unleashed dogs, barking dogs, dog bites, dangerous dogs can be reported to the SPCA 24-hours a day at 1 (877) 722-1522.



Doc REGISTRATION: Dog owners are required to purchase a yearly dog license for their dog(s) on or before 21

December 2023. As of O1 January 2024, dog registrations will be provided via the SPCA and can be purchased at a local shelter or Service New Brunswick. As well, an online registration via DocuPets will be available in 2024 (further details to follow). Proof of up-to-date rabies inoculation must be provided at the time of purchase. The cost for the dog license is \$15 for spayed or neutered dogs and \$30 for non-spayed and non-neutered dogs.

RUNNING AT LARGE: Occurs when an animal is in any place, other than on the property of the owner, and not secured by a leash which is 2 (two) metres or less in length and under control of the owner of the animal. Owners of cats must keep them on their own property and not allow them to roam, whether that means keeping them inside or on a tether when outside.

YOU MUST PICK UP AFTER YOUR PETS: Owners of animals shall immediately remove any messes left by the animal on any property. Please respect your neighbours, green space and trails around the Village.

OUTDOOR RINKS (Athletic Park)

Rinks will be open for the season in early to mid-January <u>depending on the weather.</u>

The New Maryland outdoor rinks are open daily, weather and maintenance permitting. Dusk till dawn lighting is provided for evening skating.

- The use of helmets and/or any other safety gear is recommended.
- Sticks and pucks are <u>NOT</u> allowed on the Public Skating Outdoor Rink, but <u>ARE</u> allowed on the Hockey Outdoor Rink. Note: when only one rink is open, it is a <u>SHARED</u> ice surface.
- The Village makes every effort to keep the rinks clear and ready for use; however, we encourage residents to bring a shovel to assist in the clearing of the ice surface.

SLIDING HILL (Sunrise Estates Park)

Adjacent the Sunrise Community Garden, a sliding hill has been created and shaped over the past few years that only requires a few inches of snow! One side has a gradual slope and the back side is faster


and steeper. Get outside and play in the snow!
