It's that time of year again when residents start cleaning up around their homes after the long winter months. When cleaning up your property, please keep these important dates in mind:

- Tuesday, May 22nd—Curbside Branch
 Mulching Program Begins. **Note:** the pile
 of branches for the branch mulching program is to be
 no larger than 2.4 m long x 1.22 m wide x 1.22 m high
 (8 ft x 4 ft x 4 ft)
- May 22nd (East Side) & May 23rd (West Side) Leaf Collection. <u>Note:</u> compostable bags only; plastic bags will not be accepted.






Chief Farrell would like to remind all Village residents that outdoor burning appliances must have a permit before they can be used and existing permits must be renewed annually.

Permits can be obtained from Chief Farrell by calling 450-8711.

Those who have permits for their appliance must check with the Department of Natural Resources and Energy BEFORE burning to ensure that burning is permitted or prohibited each day.

Water Treatment Process (WTP) Control Bldg.



The Village of New Maryland will be starting the construction of a Water Treatment Process (WTP) Control Building and a Booster Pump/PRV Station for the Sunrise Wellfield Development Project this summer. Village Council awarded the project to K-Line Construction Limited as per the recommendation of the Village Engineer. This project involves the construction of two buildings, the development of two sites including emergency power, paving, landscaping and security

The water treatment plant will be constructed in Sunrise Estates near Sunrise Estates Park and the booster station will be constructed along the New Maryland Highway in front of the Village's Operations Building (492 New Maryland Highway).

This wellfield development will provide redundancy for the Village's existing water system as well as allow further development in the Village. The Sunrise Wellfield Development project would not be possible without the financial support from the Federal and Provincial governments' infrastructure funding program.

YOUR GARBAGE CAN IS **NOT BEAR RESISTANT!** Never feed or approach bears * Clean and store grills

* Remove bird feeders when bears are active * Never leave pet food outdoors

* Secure food, garbage and recycling

* Wash garbage cans regularly

Store garbage in a garage, shed, or other bear resistant enclosure until the morning of garbage collection day.







That over 60% of the judging grid criteria in assessment of a community relate directly to the environment, sustainability and climate change.

That a comprehensive judging report featuring 78 specific elements in 7 categories provide feedback to each community.

Judges are required to provide specific suggestions for areas of improvement; often providing a basis for municipal budget considerations.

That the program has helped over 1,000 communities in over 30 years of existence with a cumulative economic value of over \$28 million.

ParticipACTION Community Challenge

Again this year, the Village's Recreation & Leisure Services Department has registered the Village of New Maryland to participate in the ParticipACTION Community Challenge during the month of June.

In 2023, New Maryland tracked over 1.1 million minutes, placing 8th in the Province of New Brunswick, and 66th nationally out of 2,463 participating communities throughout Canada.








Parks & Playgrounds

Noise By-law Reminder

As fairer weather approaches, the Village encourages residents to maximize their time outdoors whether it be to focus on home improvement projects, gardening, visiting neighbourhood parks or simply enjoying the peacefulness of their own backyard.



To ensure optimal enjoyment for all residents, we would like to offer a reminder about the Village Noise Control By-law regulations.

The by-law prohibits any noise that may cause a public nuisance or disturbance except for between the hours of 6:00 am to 9:00 pm Monday through Friday, and 9:00 am to 6:00 pm on Saturday, Sunday and Statutory Holidays.
